
Foreword







We gained one new inmate during the year, Joan Ackland, who was paroled later on good behavior.

To break the monotony, a club was formed with blue and gold as the colors, the blue and yellow iris as the flower, and the motto, "Be sharp, Be natural, but never Be flat." A board of directors was chosen, and served their term successfully.

The number of inmates had decreased to eighteen as we served our second term. We admitted Chuck Baker, Wilford Pacque, and Aleen Thomas to our happy little group of convicts. We lost one member, Darlene Englehart. Warden for the year was Miss Trickett. The club gave a Patch Party for the entire Penitentiary.

On our journey up the river, on the sixth day of September, 1950, twenty-one bright, conscientious "crooks" began their third term. Mrs. Berk was our keeper for the year. The traditional "Convicts' Prom" was held on April 7, 1951. An annual "Parolee-Inmate Banquet" was enjoyed.

Among the activities sponsored by the Lind Senior Inmates were: the successful Senior Play, Senior Ball and Senior party along with the Jr.-Sr. Banquet, and the Senior Sneak. (We escaped for only 25 hours.)

Harry Hays and Verna Stelzer Heimbigner returned to be released with our happy little organization.

We have served our four year term with happiness and diligence but always remember, "old Seniors never die, they just serve their term."
