
### MR. SAYRE'S MESSAGE

At the beginning of the year the Sophomore Class had 42 members, added one and lost two. The biggest part of the class is girls with 22 of them.


They gave a dance after a basketball game and sold pop and candy during basketball games.

The class gave the first dance of the year. It was held after the Quincy football game. The dance was rated as a success.





Our annual Sweetheart Ball went well and was attended by many students and






### **BRONCETTES**



The 1954 Ritzville High School Basketball Team was the best ever to wear the Red and Black. Led by Captain Glen Tompkins the Broncos were undefeated for the second straight year in League play. In the Bi-County Tournament the Broncos played inspired basketball, defeating the favorites, Davenport, Wilbur, and Almira, to enter the District tournament at Cheney. The Broncos led by hustling Glen Tompkins and sharp-shooting Wilmer Grams downed Fairfield in the first game. In the second game Danny Schwisow got a couple of timely baskets and Mead was beaten. This gave the Broncos a berth in the Class "B" State Tournament at Tacoma. In Saturday's final game to decide first and second places the taller Cheney Blackhawks led by their 6'5" center, Helm, defeated the Broncos 53-33.

In the first Class "B" Tournament game the Broncos met the tall and talented Bainbridge Spartans, who were ranked number one in the Associated Press Basketball Poll. The Bainbridge team defeated the Broncos 63-33. In the next game the Broncos showed the type of team they were by coming back and defeating Kahlotus 48-47 in an overtime game. This was one of the most exciting games of the tournament with the Broncos twice coming from behind on free throws to tie the game with seconds remaining. Danny Schwisow's long one-handers put the Broncos ahead for keeps. Fairfield was defeated by the Broncos 45-43 in another thriller that wasn't decided until the last moment, when Glen Tompkins dumped in one of his special jump shots.


In the fourth game of the tournament the Broncos were edged out by St. Pat's of Walla Walla 45-44. This gave St. Pat's 5th and the Broncos 8th place.

The 1954 Basketball team led by Captain Glen Tompkins and under the leader-ship of Coach Fred Strankman and Assistant Coach Paul McAbee finished with a season's record of 21 wins and 6 losses. The Broncos were not a tall team but played fast, aggressive basketball with the emphasis on defense and hustle.

Glen Tompkins, the Broncos playmaking guard made the All-State Team. He also made the Northern District First Team. Wilmer Grams and Danny Schwisow made the Northern District Second Team.

The Ritzville Broncos placed 8th in the State and received the 8th place trophy. This is the highest ever for a RHS team.




