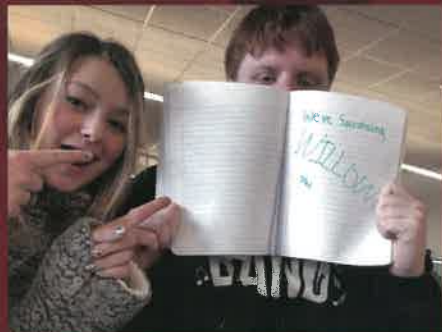

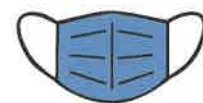
I just wear a mask because I don't want to risk spreading anything to my family. *-KALEIGH, SIMMONS (FL)*

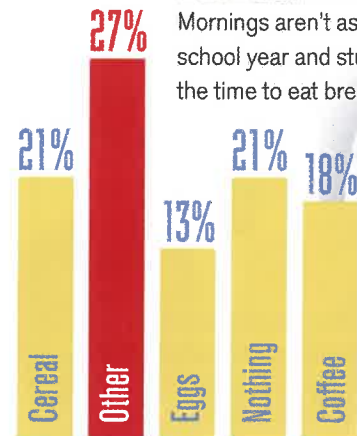
DAYTIME madness

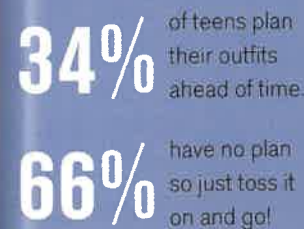
I usually don't hang out with friends after school, I go home and nap. **-RAELE, DAWKINS HIGH SCHOOL (MO)**

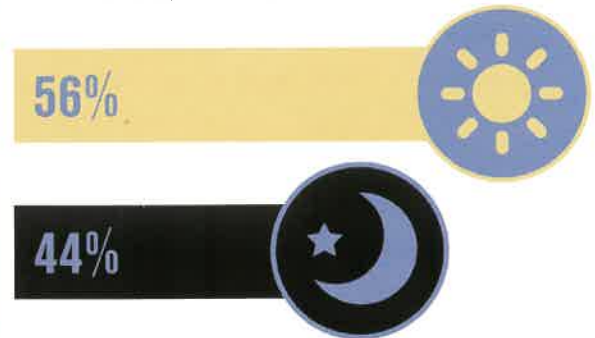

We asked teens if they preferred morning or afternoon classes...are you surprised?



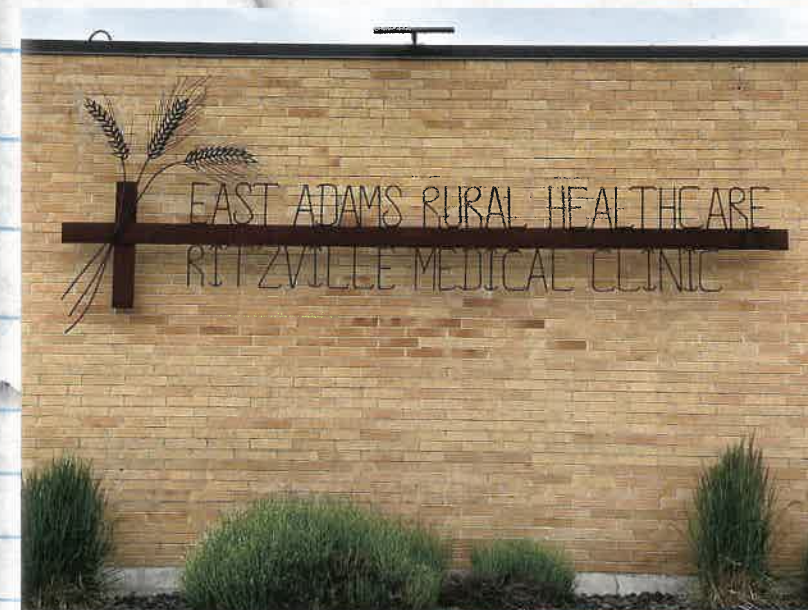
